About the Project

King's Cross Story Palace is a two year HLF funded project led by Historypin and the Building Exploratory. We aim to create a community-led history of the King's Cross area over the past 100 years. We'll do this through a programme of story gathering activities, public events, exhibitions and printed materials.

The Role

We are looking for volunteers to help carry out desk-based and archival research on the history and heritage of the King's Cross area, to enrich personal histories for inclusion in a digital archive. Research Volunteers will work closely with the project's Content Producer and the Heritage Coordinator to help with the inventory of institutional archives and the scanning of archival material.

Main Activities & Tasks

- Carry out archival research to enrich participants' stories
- Identify photographs and other visual material to support stories
- Write short statements that contextualise stories
- Write captions for visual materials
- Help to maintain and manage personal collections in line with archival practice
- Assist with the scanning of personal collection materials
